Contact your **Family/School Liaison (FSL)** or **Family Outreach Specialist (FOS)** for more information and to host a class at your site.

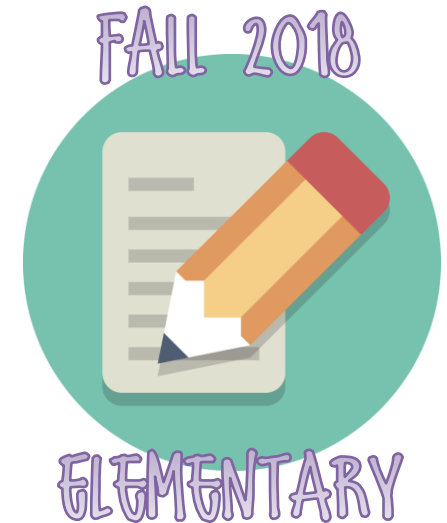
